Pursuant to Section 7 of the <u>Pesticides Act</u> R.S.O. of 1990, this Perform A Water Extermination Permit is hereby issued to:

**Treatment Site:** Water fronting multiple properties on Jack Lake

Con 15, Lots 5 & 6

Former Burleigh Township

North Kawartha, County of Peterborough

For the purpose of this Permit and the terms and conditions specified below, the following definitions apply:

### 1. **DEFINITIONS**

- (a) "Ministry" means the Ontario Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks.
- (b) "Pesticide" means the pest control products and associated <u>Pest Control Products Act</u> No. specified in this Permit
- (c) "Director" means any Ministry employee appointed by the Minister under Section 3(1) of the Pesticides Act.
- (d) "Permit" means this *Perform A Water Extermination* permit issued in accordance with *Section 7* of the *Pesticides Act*.
- (e) "PCP No." means the Pest Control Products Act number.
- (f) "Size of Treatment Area" means the approximate surface area of the water body to which the application of the pesticide is authorized.
- (g) "Maximum Application Rate" means the maximum label rate at which the pesticide may be applied to the water body.
- (h) "Amount of Pesticide to be applied" means the maximum amount of pesticide that is authorized to be used.
- (i) "Permit Holder" means 1410035 Ontario Inc.
- (j) "Treatment Period" means the period of time during which the application of the specified pesticide to water is authorized.
- (k) "Provincial Officer" means any person designated in writing by the Minister as a Provincial Officer pursuant to Section 17 of the Pesticides Act.
- (l) "Property Owner" means the owner of any property listed in the "Description of treatment location" portion of the Terms section of this permit.

### 3. CONDITIONS

- 3.0. The Permit Holder shall only use the Pesticide(s) listed in the Terms section of this Permit, shall only apply 1 treatments of the Pesticide, one treatment at each of the locations listed in the Terms section, and only in accordance with the specifications and restrictions set out in that section.
- 3.1. The issuance of, and compliance with this Permit, does not:
  - a) relieve the Permit Holder or any other person from any obligation to comply with any other applicable legal requirements, including the provisions of the Pest Control Products Act, and the Pesticides Act, and any regulations made thereunder; or

- b) limit in any way any authority of the Ministry, a Director, or a Provincial Officer, including the authority to require certain steps be taken or to require the Permit Holder to furnish any further information related to this Permit.
- 3.2. The Permit Holder shall ensure that a copy of this permit is provided to all property owners prior to the commencement of the treatment.
- 3.3. The Permit Holder shall ensure all property owners and/or occupants of the waterfront properties included in this permit are notified of the proposed treatment a minimum of 48 hours prior to the commencement of the treatment. This notification shall include information regarding the treatment date/time and restrictions on water use identified on the pesticide label. This notice shall also be provided to adjacent land-owners, lessees and/or affected parties.
- 3.4. The Permit Holder shall ensure that an analysis is conducted that evaluates the feasibility of using alternative methods of aquatic plant control at the treatment locations specified in this Permit. The evaluation shall include, but not necessarily be limited to, scientific, practical, financial and effectiveness considerations. A report shall be prepared detailing the findings of this evaluation, including: any requirements for approval(s); impacts to plant and animal life within Sharpe's Bay of Jack Lake; nutrient cycling and water quality impacts; effectiveness for plant control and other relevant criteria as appropriate. The Permit Holder shall ensure that a copy of this report is provided to the attention of the Regional Pesticides Specialist, Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks, 1259 Gardiners Road, Unit 3, Kingston ON K7P 3J6; or by e-mail to Scott.Olan@ontario.ca, prior to December 31, 2021.
- 3.5. The Permit Holder shall ensure treatment is only performed in water fronting properties where the Property Owner has provided consent.
- 3.6. When using the Pesticide for swimming areas or for boating channels, the Permit Holder shall only use the Pesticide treatment
  - (a) for swimming areas where aquatic plant growth is sufficient to interfere with swimming. Treatment for swimming areas shall not exceed 15 metres along the shoreline or 30 metres into the body of water.
  - (b) for boating channels where aquatic plant growth is, or is likely to become, sufficient to interfere with the safe operation of water craft.
- 3.8. The Permit Holder shall not use the Pesticide specified in this Permit, Reward®, for aesthetic purposes or for the treatment of emergent aquatic vegetation (e.g., cattails, wild rice, bulrushes, water lilies, etc.).
- 3.9. Following treatment with Reward®, the Permit Holder shall take all reasonable measures to ensure that the treated water is not used for swimming or animal consumption for 24 hours and human consumption or irrigation for five (5) days.
- 3.10. The Permit Holder shall ensure any situations involving health or environmental effects or damage to property related to the treatment(s) authorized by this Permit is reported immediately to the local Ministry's Peterborough District Office, 1-800-558-0595; or if a pesticide spill occurs, to the Spills Action Centre at 1-800-268-6060.

- 3.11. The Permit Holder shall ensure that a summary reporting form is completed and returned to the attention of the Regional Pesticides Specialist, Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks, 1259 Gardiners Road, Unit 3, Kingston ON K7P 3J6; or by e-mail to Scott.Olan@ontario.ca, prior to December 31, 2021.
- 3.12. This Permit expires on January 1, 2022.

## 4. <u>APPEALS AND NOTIFICATION</u>

In accordance with section 13(9) of the Pesticides Act, R. S. O. 1990, Chapter P. 11, as amended, you may by written notice served upon the Director require that the Director, within 3 days of receipt of such notice, vary, rescind or confirm his or her decision. The Director, within 3 days of receipt of such notice shall serve or cause to be served upon you this decision together with his or her written reasons therefor and where the Director varies or rescinds the decision, the Director shall take such action as may be necessary to make the variation or rescission effective.

In accordance with section 13(10) of the Pesticides Act, R. S. O. 1990, Chapter P. 11, as amended, you may by written notice served upon the Director and the Environmental Review Tribunal, within 15 days of service upon you of the notice under section 13(9) of the Pesticides Act, request a hearing of the Environmental Review Tribunal.
